The College's Basic Carnegie Classification is *Baccalaureate College: Diverse Fields*, indicating that more than 50% of degrees awarded are at the baccalaureate level. The institution's Instructional Program Classification is Professions Plus Arts & Sciences, meaning that 60-79% of bachelor's degree majors are in professional fields designed to meet the region's college-educated workforce needs, such as business, education, and health. The emphasis is on teaching and service with limited focus on basic or applied research activity.
