Dear Dr. Wheelan:

This letter comes to inform you that the College of Coastal Georgia and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) have formed a partnership that will allow students at the law enforcement training center to receive college credit for some of the extensive training they undergo. Those in basic training at the Center can earn up to a total of 12 credit hours through the College in four different courses – Introduction to Criminal Justice, Introduction to Law Enforcement, Introduction to Criminal Law, and Introduction to Criminal Investigation. The credit hours can be applied towards degree programs from the College or transferred to another college or university.

For your records, our SACSCOC Accreditation Liaison, Dr. Jim Lynch, had a conversation recently with Dr. Sarah Armstrong regarding this arrangement and since FLETC is not certified by Department of Education to participate in Title IV funding, it was recommended that this letter of notification about the arrangement and a copy of the signed agreement be sent to you.
