This letter is to notify you that the College of Coastal Georgia (CCGA) has decided not to renew its MoU with the University System of Georgia's eLanguage cooperative programs, effective June 30, 2020:

- Bachelor of Arts with a major in French Language and Literature
- Bachelor of Arts with a major in Spanish Language and Literature


The institution decided that it is no longer feasible to continue offering the eMajors mentioned above that have had relatively little student demand. The College is committed to providing quality education, and therefore, made a strategic cut to maintain and improve the quality of the programs that were retained.

CCGA is taking the following steps to assist students, faculty, and staff affected by discontinuing the program.

- All students who have declared a major in French or Spanish Language and Literature will receive a notification letter from the Dean of the School of Arts & Sciences, informing them that their program has been discontinued.
- The student notification letter includes the date of termination for the program and information describing the teach-out plan.
- Each student will be provided an individualized academic map, which will enable him or her to complete the program requirements within the teach-out period assuming they are within 45 hours of program completion. Course offerings in the discontinued program will continue through Fall 2021 based on the MoU with Clayton State and Valdosta State Universities which allow students already enrolled in the program three semesters to complete their coursework leading to completion of the program.
- The faculty advisor for these programs will offer each student the option of selecting a different major, such as the Bachelor of Science in Interdisciplinary Sciences where the majority (if not all) of a student's coursework could be used, or transferring to another institution to complete their degree.
- No new students will be enrolled in the program beginning in Summer 2020.
- The College of Coastal Georgia currently employs no full-time Language faculty. Thus, reassignment or termination of faculty will not be needed.
