Prohibition of Weapons On Campus

Policy Statement

Possession of weapons on the College of Coastal Georgia campus is governed by Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §16-11-127.1). Under the law, weapons are not allowed on the College of Coastal Georgia campus, subject only to certain exceptions.

Reason for Policy

This policy is intended to provide guidance to all faculty, staff, students and visitors to the College so as to ensure compliance with O.C.G.A. §16-11-127.1.

Entities Affected By This Policy

All faculty, staff, students, and visitors to the College are covered by this policy.

Who Should Read This Policy

All faculty, staff, students, and visitors to the College should read and be familiar with this policy.

Definitions

The following definitions are outlined in O.C.G.A. §16-11-127.1:

- **School Safety Zone:** "School safety zone" means in or on any real property or building owned by or leased to any public or private technical school, vocational school, college, university, or other institution of postsecondary education. O.C.G.A. §16-11-127.1(a)(3)(B)
- **Weapon:** "Weapon" means and includes any pistol, revolver, or any weapon designed or intended to propel a missile of any kind, or any dirk, bowie knife, switchblade knife, ballistic knife, any other knife having a blade of two or more inches, straight-edge razor, razor blade, spring stick, knuckles, whether made from metal, thermoplastic, wood, or other similar material, blackjack, any bat, club, or other bludgeon-type weapon, or any flailing instrument consisting of two or more rigid parts connected in such a manner as to allow them to swing freely, which may be known as a nun chahka, nun chuck, nunchaku, shuriken, or fighting chain, or any disc, of whatever configuration, having at least two points or pointed blades which is designed to be thrown or propelled and which may be known as a throwing star or oriental dart, or any weapon of like kind, and any stun gun or taser as defined in subsection (a) of Code Section 16-11-106. This paragraph excludes any of these instruments used for classroom work authorized by the teacher. O.C.G.A. §16-11-127.1(a)(4). An "electroshock weapon" means any commercially available device that is powered by electrical charging units and designed exclusively to be capable of incapacitating a person by electrical charge, including, but not limited to, a stun gun or taser as defined in subsection (a) of Code Section 16-11-106. O.C.G.A. §16-11-127.1(c)(19)

Overview

Under the law, weapons are not allowed on the College of Coastal Georgia campus, subject only to certain exceptions found in O.C.G.A. §16-11-127.1. Georgia Code Title 16, Chapter 11, Article 4, Part 3 (Carrying and Possession of Firearms) provides information according to Georgia state law regarding weapons on school safety zones.
