

# Semipro team improves to 6-0

## Glynn County shuts out South Ga.

With a torturing cold and windy night as a backdrop, Lanier Field was the stage Saturday for a few modern-day gladiators to do battle.

The Glynn County Revolution semipro football team sent the visiting South Georgia Rams back to Moultrie frostbitten and with a 24-0 licking that improved the

Revolution's season record to a perfect 6-0.

Revolution head coach and owner Jeffrey Waters reiterated the mission of the team he began five years ago with money out of his own pocket.
