

Glynn County Farm Bureau Student Scholarships

Each year Glynn County Farm Bureau (GCFB) in coordination with the local high schools and institutions of higher learning in Glynn County, will award student scholarships. The one-year scholarships will be tiered and variable. Part-time students, (6 to 11 credit hours), will also be eligible.

These funds will be available to pay the cost of tuition, books, lab fees, field trip assessments, and additional academic related expenses not covered by other scholarships or grants. Students will submit vouchers, invoices, bills, or other debit paperwork to the GCFB Office Manager for payment. Unused funds at the end of the school year will revert back to the general scholarship account at GCFB.

Students awarded the scholarships will be selected by GCFB Scholarship Committee. The criteria for selection are: The student must be in good academic standing with a grade point average of at least 3.0 for baccalaureate degree students and a 2.5 GPA for technical career students. A waiver can be granted regarding the 3.0 GPA after review for special circumstances.

The student's current transcript and a one-page description of the student's educational goals, school and/or community volunteering involvement, and how the scholarship will help them attain their goals is also required.
