

## College of Coastal Georgia student Garrett Moseley is constantly trying to defy the odds. He doesn't believe in letting anything

experiencing muscular dystrophy for most of his life. Moseley, 18, has already accomplished many things. He graduated from high school early and was at the top of his class, has been published in a mathematics journal, and is considered to be a senior at the College based on his numerous credits earned through dual enrollment. Moseley uses his Moseley has Emery Dreifuss Muscular Dystrophy, one of the rarest forms of muscular dystrophy and a lifelong condition. It primarily weakens the heart and the muscles of his arms, legs, and neck. Moseley was diagnosed in the first grade and was told that he would be in a wheelchair by age 16. He was also born with

two extra valves in his heart. One valve was corrected via ablation and the second healed on its own. "I am blessed to have a lot of strength, and I am continually defying the odds. I am proud to say that I can still walk and carry out my daily life with little to no problems," he said. "There is never anything I can't do.


