

Student Right-to-Know Act Graduation Rate Report

Per the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, the College of Coastal Georgia would like to share the graduation rates of the Fall 2017 cohort of first-time, full-time, baccalaureate degree-seeking undergraduate students.

As reported in the IPEDS graduation rates survey (GRS), during the Fall 2017 semester, 469 first-time, full-time, baccalaureate degree-seeking undergraduate students entered Coastal Georgia. Twenty-six percent of these students had graduated from Coastal Georgia within 150% of the normal time to complete their degree (as of August 31, 2023). For example, for a four-year degree program, entering students who complete within six years are counted as graduates.
